### Design changes to the Desert Camp Project

### Residents can comment on Industrial Project

DC Ranch strengthened its position by joining with Ironwood Village to submit comments to both the Mack Company and City of Scottsdale for changes/additions to the Industrial Project Mack Company plans to build on 125 acres just south of DC Ranch. The intent is to make the project more respectful, consistent, and integrated with the adjacent neighbors.

### DCR-24 Speeding Standard amended

On May 8, the Ranch Association Board of Directors voted to amend DCR-24 Speeding, which lowers the excessive speeding definition to over 10 mph above the posted speed limit as well as clarifying enforcement capabilities for the organization. The speed limit is 15 mph unless posted otherwise. DC Ranch does not enforce speeds on Thompson Peak Parkway, Legacy Boulevard or Pima Road. The Ranch Association has two speed cameras that can be relocated to various locations throughout the community to address speeding concerns. The fine for excessive speeding is \$300 and could be escalated to a minimum of \$300 for each subsequent offense, or as the Board determines appropriate.

If an owner (including family or guests) incurs more than three \$300 speeding fines in a 12-month period, the owner will be subject to additional enforcement. Read more.

### Community Safety Series: 9-1-1 misdialing

It's an almost universal experience – misdialing 9-1-1 and quickly hanging up, or accidentally pressing the emergency button on a cell phone. Whether an error or emergency, the Scottsdale Police Department (SPD) has a duty to respond to all 9-1-1 calls, even those that get disconnected. If you inadvertently make a call or dial 9-1-1 please stay on the line and speak to the dispatcher to let them know you mistakenly dialed the wrong number. If you notice that your phone has pocket dialed 9-1-1 and then hung up, call the SPD nonemergency number 480.312.5000 to let them know that there is no emergency. Finally, if you receive a call or text from a 9-1-1 dispatch center, take the call and let them know if law enforcement is needed or if the dial was just an accident.
