94th St. residential approved with stipulations

The new residential community to be built at the northeast corner of 94th Street and Bell Road was recently given the green light to proceed by the City of Scottsdale Design Review Board (DRB). At the request of DC Ranch, and stipulated in the DRB approval, trees will be added along the northern portion of the property as a buffer to the Desert Haciendas neighborhood. Also, the pathway along 94th Street from Bell Road north to DC Ranch's property line will be reinstated. When funds are available, the Community Council will add a "connector" to enable residents to walk to Bell Road.

Plans call for the developer to install a crosswalk on 94th Street. It will most likely be placed north of the entrance to the new community and is referred to as a "Rapid Rectangular Flashing Beacon Crossing" on the site drawings.

This land is not in DC Ranch. The development is single-family homes on significantly larger lots than required by zoning (1/4 to 1/2 acre in size) and will include a community center with an outdoor activity area at Bell Road.

Holiday parking reminder

Residents hosting parties should request that guests park with the flow of traffic and avoid parking in cul-de-sacs. Always allow for at least one lane of traffic in case emergency vehicle access is needed. Please do not park on sidewalks or block driveways or fire hydrants. Any overnight parking for guests must be pre-approved and permitted by DC Ranch. Fill out the <u>Parking Exemption form</u>.

Home safety recommendations

- If there is a crime in progress, dial 911 immediately. DC Ranch Community Patrol and Gate Access (CPGA) does not respond to or investigate crime.
- If you notice something in your neighborhood that seems unusual, call CPGA at 480.397.9659 immediately.
- Secure all valuables within the confines of your home or garage. Leaving items outside can result in them being stolen and/or calling attention to your home.
- Make sure garage doors are closed when not in use. Open garages are among the leading access points for burglaries.
- If you are out of town or not home, leave random lights on in the house to prevent it from looking vacant.
- If you are on an extended trip, fill out a <u>Vacation Watch</u> form for CPGA to make occasional perimeter checks of your home while you're away.
