Path and trail etiquette

The community's path and trail system is a favorite among residents. For safety reasons, motorized vehicles such as golf carts, ATVs and skateboards are not permitted on sidewalks or the paths and trails. Bicyclists are also reminded to slow down when nearing pedestrians. Only battery-operated toy vehicles for children 7 or younger may be driven on the path system or sidewalks under the supervision of an adult.

Update to modification process for security enhancements

To assist residents in their efforts for security enhancements to their homes and to ensure adherence to community standards, temporary updates to the submittal process have been instituted. Visit DCRanch.com for more information on the process and to submit a modification form for security cameras and/or motionactivated lights.

Installation of internal home security systems and/or "Ring" style doorbells do not require prior approval from the Modification Committee or Ranch Association staff.

Short-term rental policy reminder

The standards for Rental of Property (DCR-18) do not allow rentals less than 6 months, with only two rentals permitted during a calendar year. Rental and lease terms lasting fewer than 6 months are prohibited. The Ranch Association actively monitors property rental websites to ensure compliance with these requirements. Fines for infractions of short-term rentals may be imposed.

Community Standards for Natural Open Space (NOS)

NOS areas are land owned by DC Ranch or the owner of a private lot, with the easement acting as a deed restriction. A city of Scottsdale ordinance mandates the dedication of NOS to permanently preserve specific environmental features including washes, mountain ridges and desert plants. These easements are dedicated common tracts within subdivisions or on lots throughout DC Ranch.

Standards for Landscape <u>DCRL-09</u> states that the only maintenance that should be done in these areas is removing foreign debris, such as trash, construction debris and invasive grasses or plants. Trimming for safety concerns requires prior approval by calling The Ranch Offices at 480.513.1500.
