Ranch Association Board of Directors election

Neighborhood Voting Members (NVMs) in each of the 44 neighborhoods have received their ballots to elect two individuals to the Ranch Association Board of Directors. New directors will each serve a three-year term to represent residents, create or amend DC Ranch policy, and attend monthly meetings. NVMs have until April 1 at 5 p.m. to cast their ballot.
