Thank you to Firewise Committee

The Firewise Committee was chartered in 2021 and with their work complete, the committee has been dissolved. Over the past three years the committee collaborated with the Ranch Association and the Scottsdale Fire Department to provide valuable input on clearing 17-miles of ladder fuels within DC Ranch. Special thanks to resident committee members Andrea Brin, Kris James, John Shaw and Paul Staker for their help in this enormous task to protect the community.

Construction started on dog park

The recently fenced area on the southwest corner of Thompson Peak Pkwy. and Hayden Rd. signaled the start of construction on a much-needed dog park. Approved by voters in the 2019 Scottsdale bond election, the city facility will include three fenced play areas for dogs, shade canopies, benches, water fountains, pet waste disposal stations, restrooms, and public art. A footbridge will connect the off-leash area to existing park amenities. Entrance to the parking area will be from Hayden Rd. The park is anticipated to open at the end of the year. Learn more.



Desert Camp Site Improvement Project Update

Over the last two months, significant progress has been made at Desert Camp. Within the existing building, framing is going in for the planned renovations. The land for the expansion was raised and leveled, and the team began construction of the foundations and stem walls. The pickleball site was graded, the ground was prepared with plastic-covered steel cables running in a grid pattern, and concrete was poured over that to create the post-tensioned courts. Irrigation systems should be tested regularly to ensure efficiency and water conservation. Signs you may have damage or a leak include water runoff into the street, uncommon wet areas in your landscape, low water pressure and bubbling water.

Travel preparedness

The end of the school year is here and summer travel season is quickly approaching. Residents are encouraged to complete a <u>Vacation Notification form</u> to alert Community Patrol of any extended leaves so they can keep an extra eye on your home while you're away. They will conduct regular perimeter checks and look for anything suspicious. Spring cleaning

Community Standard DCR-02 states that activities not normally associated with property restricted to residential use, including operation of a business, garage, yard and estate sales, or other commercial, manufacturing, or industrial use are prohibited. Homebased businesses or hobbies are permissible unless they generate excessive noise or traffic, create unsightly conditions visible to neighboring property or otherwise cause a nuisance pursuant to DCR-10. The Ranch Association, in its sole discretion, shall determine if an activity is in violation of this standard. Property owners shall maintain their property in good, clean, safe, and attractive conditions.

Living Connected

In celebration of 2024 Scottsdale Earth Week, the Ranch Association's Adopt-A-Road Landscape & Maintenance Team performed trash and litter clean-up along Thompson Peak Parkway from Pima Road to Legacy Boulevard and Legacy Boulevard East to The Homestead Community Center, collecting 25 large bags of trash and litter from along the roadways and medians.

The annual Gives Shred Day in partnership with the Matheson Real Estate Team was a resounding success. A total of 124 cars rolled into The Homestead parking lot to shred sensitive documents and over \$2,200 was collected to benefit the Arizona Cancer Foundation for Children. This generous contribution will provide vital support to children and families affected by pediatric cancer.



Weed maintenance

It is typical to see an influx of weeds during rainy months like April and July. The Landscape team is currently underway with the weed reduction program which should be complete by end of May. One of the most common invasive weeds in DC Ranch is globe chamomile, or stinknet (pictured). Residents should remove this plant from their yards before it dries and turns to seed in the early summer.
