Update on state land parcels along Loop 101

The land at the northwest corner of Pima and the Loop 101 is owned by the State Land Department. It is currently being used by the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) as a staging and storage area for Loop 101 Freeway Expansion Project.

On June 4, the state of Arizona held an auction for 75 acres on the SW corner of the Loop 101 and Scottsdale Road. The property sold at the \$28M minimum bid to an LLC that lists Anne O'Moore as its agent.

The 110 acres of state land the former Coyotes' owner hopes to buy will go to auction on June 27. It is located at the NW corner of Scottsdale Road and the Loop 101 and will start at a minimum bid of \$68.5M.

Annual audit completed on DC Ranch financial records

Per Arizona State Law, § 33-1243, an audit, review or compilation shall be completed no later than 180 days after the end of the association's fiscal year and shall be made available on request to the owners within 30 days of its completion. An audit is an examination of the association's financial statements, accounting records, internal controls and procedures by an independent certified public accountant. The purpose of an audit is to express an opinion as to whether the financial statements are fairly presented in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP). The firm Butler Hansen conducted audits of the Ranch Association and Community Council for fiscal year 2023. Both entities have been issued an unqualified opinion (or "clean opinion") that states the financial statements are presented fairly in all material respects. The audit was reviewed by the Association and Council finance committees and presented at each respective Board meeting.

Construction starting for 94th St. and Bell Rd. subdivision

American First Builders received its city permit to begin plant salvaging and grading on their new 52 lot subdivision at the northwest corner of 94th Street and Bell Road. This land is not in DC Ranch. <u>View project information</u>.
