Community center access upgrade

On Oct. 1, all key fobs for the community centers were deactivated. A new access system is being put into place to replace the existing key fobs with a phone app. All residents will need to complete a household registration form and facility agreement waiver before receiving access to facilities and amenities. Apply to become an NVM

Each year, Neighborhood Voting Members (NVMs) are elected by their neighbors to serve as liaisons between neighborhood residents and the Ranch Association Board of Directors. The Ranch Association holds elections each November to elect resident representatives for one-year terms. With 44 positions in total, one for each neighborhood in DC Ranch, NVMs are responsible for disseminating important information to neighbors and for casting the votes for the neighborhood they represent during Ranch Association Board elections. Commercial building construction moving along

After a long pause over the summer, construction has resumed on the two, one-story commercial buildings being developed at Legacy Blvd. and 91st St. This land was designated as part of DC Ranch Crossing when DC Ranch was originally designed. The project has over 19,000 sq. ft. in total and will lease to various tenants primarily in the service industry. Construction is scheduled through March 2025.
